<u>Water Conditions:</u> Matt Meadows reported on water conditions on the Kings River. May precipitation ended up above the average amount, and April was double the average amount of precipitation, which has helped the total numbers for the water year.

Mr. Meadows also reported that limited Army Corps facilities were opened for public access in the marinas. Mr. Meadows reported that dumping has been slowed down near Winton park due to installation of a gate, but that people are still cutting the chain to continue dumping.

a. <u>Annual Technical Report (Matt Meadows)</u>

The Committee was updated on the Annual Technical Report of 2019 activities, and was asked to officially accept the report as presented and approve it for posting.
